109 patients (60%) have ACCESSED at least one community resource.

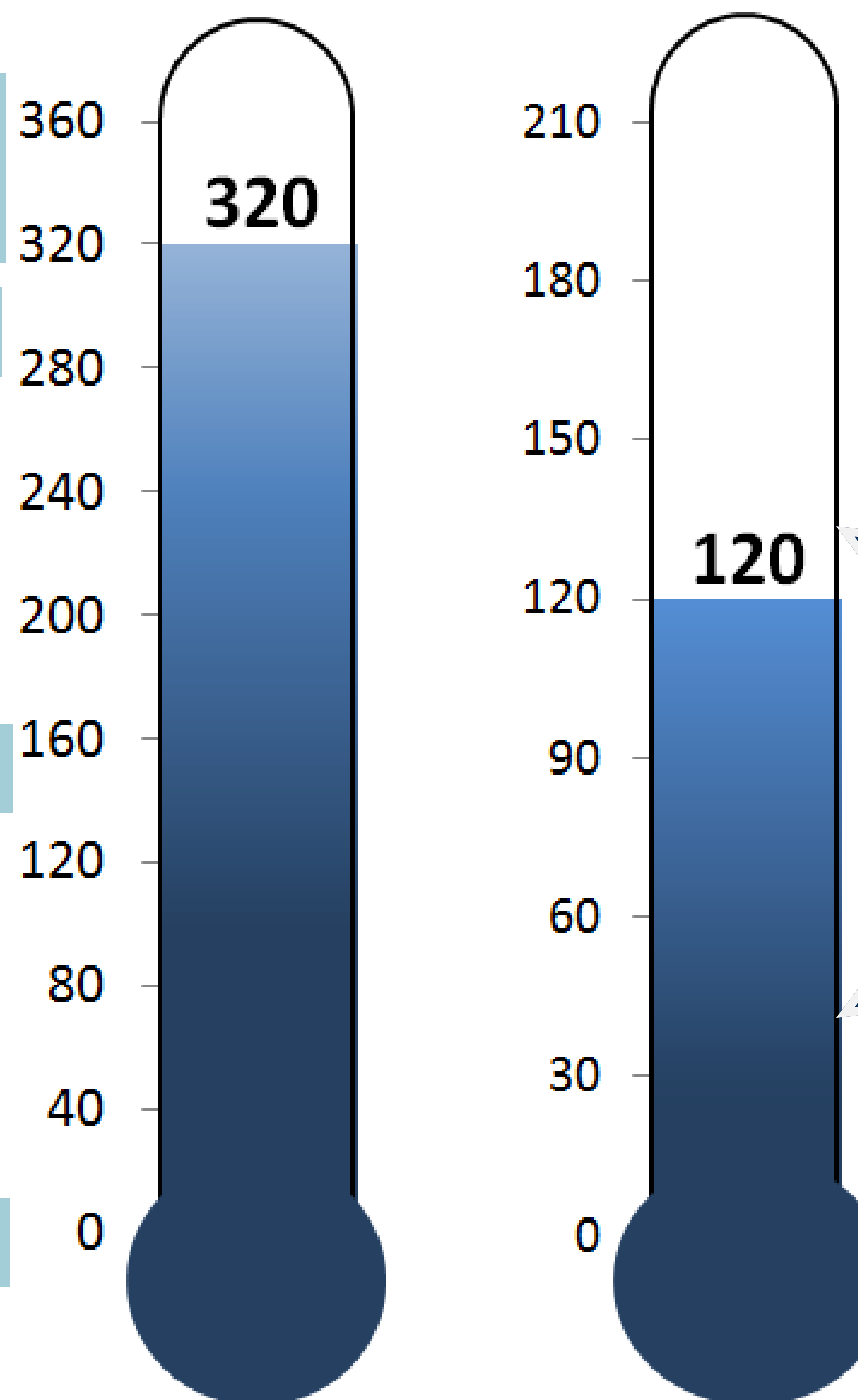

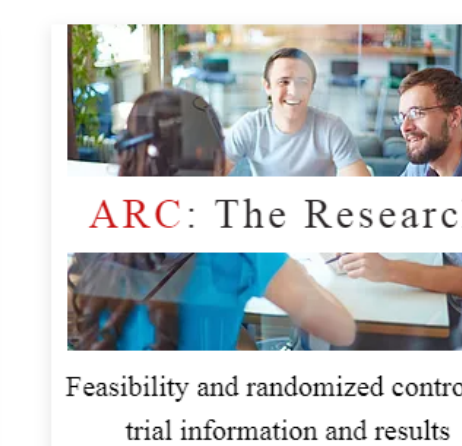

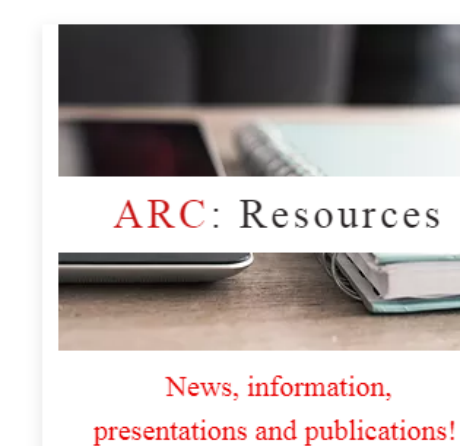
