What is ARC?

A research study that aims to optimize equitable Access to Resources in the Community for primary care patients.

The ARC study has received a total of 457 patient referrals!

Total number of patients enrolled to date

Ottawa

246 (74%) patients were enrolled



Sudbury

78 (62%) patients were enrolled

To date, 204 patients have completed their participation in the ARC study.

127 patients (62%) have **ACCESSED** at least one community resource.
